SEALING

In the Bible many different seals are mentioned. Some of them are literal. others symbolic. A seal leaves a mark in clay or wax, which can signify authority, confirmation, approval, ownership, or genuineness. Letters and documents were sealed indicating the author. The seal normally carried the owner's name and position.

To Abraham the sea of the righteousness of faith was circumcision (Rom. 4:11). This outward sign indicated that he was a child of God. In a similar way for us, especially in the last days the Sabbath will be a visible outward sign, indicating that we are children of God.

Jesus was sealed by the Father (John 6:27). This was done at His baptism by the voice of God and by many miracles. This was a sign of ownership, indicating that He was the Son of God. God's foundation had a different seal as we find in 2 Tim. 2:19.

Seal By the Holy Spirit

At conversion we are sealed by the Holy Spirit, "And grieve not the Holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption." Eph. 4:30. "Who hath also sealed us, and given the earnest of the spirit in our hearts." 2 Cor. 1:22. "For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father. The Spirit itself beareth the witness with our spirit, that we are the children of God. Romans 8:15-16.

This spirit of adoption in us makes us the children of God. It is a seal that God has placed into all His faithful followers. The Holy Spirit in us is called the seal of promise. (Eph. 1:13).

"In the work that was accomplished on the day of Pentecost, we may see what can be done by the exercise of faith. Those who believed in Christ were sealed by the Holy Spirit." BC, Vol. 6, p. 1055. This seal is our title to heaven, but we can lose this seal by grieving the Holy Spirit.

Ananias and Sapphira received the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost with other believers and made a promise to sell their house and to give all the money to the church. But later they yielded to the feelings of covetousness and decided to keep some of the money back. By this they lost the Holy Spirit, the seal and they were no more the children of God. (AA, 71-72).

King Saul lost the Holy Spirit because of his disobedience. "But the Spirit of the Lord departed from Saul, and an evil spirit from the Lord troubled him." 1 Sam. 16:14.

Sealing by the Third Angel

"Saith the angel, the third angel is binding or sealing them in bundles for the heavenly garner." EW 89.

Who is the third angel?

"No one hears the voice of these angels, for they are a symbol to represent the people of God who are working in harmony with the universe of heaven. Men and women enlightened by the Spirit of God, and sanctified through the truth, proclaim these three messages in their order." LS 429.

Here the people of God are the sealing angel. Those who are enlightened by the Spirit of God and sanctified will be binding and sealing the people for the heavenly garner.

"Then I saw the third angel. Saith my accompanying angel, 'Fearful is his work. Awful is his mission. He is the angel that is to select the wheat from the tares, and seal, or bind, the wheat for the heavenly garner." EW 118.

What is the seal that the third angel is placing upon us?

"While living under and proclaiming the most solemn message ever borne to mortals, presenting the law of God as a test of character and as the seal of the living God, they are transgressing its holy precepts." Test. Vol. 2, p. 468.

"We are to be distinguished form the world because God has placed His seal upon us, because He manifests in us His own holy character of love." MH 37.

"As Jesus passed into the holiest, and stood before the ark containing the law of God, He sent the third angel into the world." EW 254.

This seal is the character of God in us, and the obedience to the law of God. This is placed on the people by the third angel. The sealing that the message third angel proclaims will prepare them for the next seal which is indelible. This sealing work started in 1844 when Jesus entered the most holy place in the heavenly sanctuary and will continue to the end of the time of probation.

Indelible Seal

"And I saw another angel ascending from the east, having the seal of the living God: and he cried with a loud voice to the four angels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, Saying, hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads. And I heard the number of them which were sealed: and there were sealed an hundred and forty and four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel." Rev. 7:2-4.

Also in Ezekiel we learn of an angel with a writer's inkhorn by his side to whom the Lord said, "Go through the midst of the city, through the midst of Jerusalem, and set a mark upon the foreheads of the men that sigh and cry for all the abominations that are done in the midst thereof." Eze. 9:4. Here the angel of God does the sealing of the hundred and forty and four thousand. This seal we cannot lose anymore. It is an indelible seal.

"What is the seal of the living God, which is placed in the foreheads of His people? It is a mark which angels, but not human eyes can read, for the destroying angel must see this mark of redemption." BC, Vol. 7, p. 968.

"This mightiest of angels has in his hand the seal of the living God, of Him who alone can give life, who can inscribe upon the foreheads the mark or inscription, to whom shall be granted immortality, eternal life." TM 444-445.

"The indelible mark of God is upon them. God can plead that His own name is written there." TM 446.

"They served Him with the intellect and with the heart, and now He can place His name in their foreheads." AA 591.

"If in the families there are those who are refusing obedience to the Lord in keeping the Sabbath, then the seal cannot be placed upon them. The sealing is a pledge from God of perfect security to His chosen ones. (Ex. 31:13-17). Sealing indicates that you are God's chosen. He has appropriated you to Himself. As the sealed of God we are Christ's purchased possession, and no one shall pluck us out of His hands. The seal given in the forehead is God, New Jerusalem, 'I will write upon him the name of My God, and the name of the city of My God.' (Rev. 3:12)." Manuscript Releases 15, p. 225.

Conditions for Receiving the Seal

"The seal of the living God is placed upon those who conscientiously keep the Sabbath of the Lord." The Last Day Events, p. 220.

"The seal of the living God will be place upon those only who bear a likeness to Christ in character." BC, Vol. 7, p. 970.

"Many hear the invitation of mercy, are tested and proved but few are sealed with the seal of the living God. Few will humble themselves as a little child, that they may enter into the kingdom of heaven." Test. Vol. 5, p. 50.

"Many who have never had the light, they are deceived by their teachers, and they have not received the mark of the beast. The Lord will not withdraw His grace from them." BC, Vol. 7, p. 976. This refers to those who from ignorance keep Sunday while the mark of the beast is forced upon us.

When Will this Sealing Take Place?

"In a little while everyone who is a child of God will have His seal placed upon him. O that it may be placed upon our foreheads: Who can endure the thought of being passed by when the angel goes forth to seal the servants of God in their foreheads." Rev. & Her., May 28, 1889. "Image of the beast will be formed and Sunday worship will be enforced before the people of God are sealed. They must pass this test in order to receive the seal of God." BC, Vol. 7, p. 976.

"The decree enforcing the worship of Sunday is to go forth to all the world. In a limited degree it is already gone forth. In- several places the civil power is speaking with the voice of the dragon." Signs of the Times, May 6, 1897.

Next Event after Sealing

"Just as God's people are sealed and prepared for the shaking, it will come." BC, Vol. 4, p. 1161.

After the shaking the latter rain will be poured out. EW 270-271, Test. Vol. 5, p. 81.

The Final Seal

There is one more seal that we will receive and this is placed upon us by Jesus Himself.

"Their experience will be one of constant growth, until the Lord shall descend from heaven with power and great glory to set His seal of final triumph upon His faithful ones." Retirement Years, p. 29.

We are living today in the sealing time, but soon it will be finished and many will be like the foolish virgins without the oil in their vessels. Many will be found wanting in their characters. The perfect image of Jesus is not visible in them and the sealing angel will pass by them.

Let us make sure that we will be sealed by the Holy Spirit and that the third angel also will set his seal upon us. The Sabbath which is the visible seal of God we must have, and then we will be able to receive the invisible seal of God upon our foreheads which angels only can see, and finally when Jesus places His seal upon us at His coming the sealing work will be finished.

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"Be sober, be vigilant; because your adversary the devil, as a roaring lion, walketh about, seeking whom he may devour:" 1 Peter 5:8

At this stage in the history of the world the devil is becoming desperate. His activities are increasing proportionately as the history of this world draws to a close. He is seeking to devour as many as he can. He has succeeded in bringing the majority of the world under his black banner, but there are those few who refuse to follow his way. They are just a small remnant that have overcome by the blood of the Lamb and are so closely connected with their Saviour that they have been able to keep themselves beyond his reach. He is incensed by those few and focusing his attacks on them. He is determined to have the whole world on his side when Jesus comes the second time. He wants to show God that it is impossible for any man to keep His commandments. One of the greatest deceptions that he uses is that Jesus had some advantage over man whereby He was able to live a sinless life but man is not capable of doing so. Into this deception he has led the majority of the Christian world. But there are those few who have kept their robes unspotted from the world, those few who are following the Lamb, "withersoever He goeth." Those he is attempting to destroy.

He knows where to find them today in God's church. He is going out to find any weakness in the members and work on those weaknesses. Has he been successful? We read that, "Many a star that we have admired for its brilliance will then go out in darkness." Prophets and Kings, p. 188. Yes, he has had a measure of success. His deceptions are so subtle though that it is "possible to deceive the very elect." But of course they won't be deceived. What about those who have not fully surrendered their lives 100% to Jesus? Yes, they acknowledge the truth is correct, they come to church and pay their tithes and offerings and take an active part in church activities but they have not

made Jesus their personal Saviour. These ones will not stand when Satan comes with his attacks. Only those who are connected to the living vine will be safe; those who have made Jesus their best friend.

Some, who are not fully connected, while giving an assent to the truth, may start to slide in their personal lives. Nothing serious at first – just little things.

For example: Guarding the edges of the Sabbath. How strict are we with the hours of the Sabbath? If we start a few minutes late or end just a few minutes early because we have to go out then is that ok? A minute here and there may not seem so important, but one minute will lead to two, and then five; after that it leads to hours. Finally it leads to all of the Sabbath hours losing their sanctity. Yet it started with only a minute.

Health Reform. Sister White writes many counsels in the book Counsels on Diet and Foods. And it is easy to let a few of these points slide. We may not think there is any harm in eating a cracker or two between meals (she writes that not one morsel should enter our mouth between meals). Or perhaps eating a sweet that is not particularly snack healthful - but it is small. These things that may seem small and of minor importance will lead to bigger things. Indulgence of appetite is very difficult to bring under control again.

There are many other areas in life where Satan tempts us to think that it is just a "little thing" and something not to worry about, but in God's eyes all sins are big. Every sin, however small it may seem to us, cost the life of His Son. Every sin is horrible in His eyes.

ACHAN

We will get into the story of Achan now. It is a very well known story in the Bible, but if you don't know it please read it in Joshua chapter seven. How did Achan end up this way? Was it a momentary slip-up that he made? Was it a momentary

feeling of covetousness that suddenly came over him causing him to act rashly? And why was his whole family punished with him? "It is because they had not been trained and educated according to the directions given them in the great standard of the law of God. Achan's parents had educated their son in such a way that he felt free to disobey the word of the Lord. The principles inculcated in his life led him to deal with his children in such a way that they also were corrupted. Mind acts and reacts upon mind, and the punishment, which included the relations of Achan with himself, reveals the fact that all were involved the transgression." Child in Guidance, p. 234.

From this story of Achan we can glean many important counsels. First let's read from *Patriarchs and Prophets*, pp. 496-498.

The whole nation was held responsible for the sin of Achan. which started with covetousness and vet this sin is one of the most lightly regarded of sins. "The deadly sin that led to Achan's ruin had its root in covetousness, of all sins one of the most common and the most lightly regarded. While other offenses meet with detection and punishment, how rarely does the violation of the tenth commandment so much as call forth censure. The enormity of this sin, and the terrible results, are the lessons of Achan's history.

"Covetousness is an evil of gradual development. Achan had cherished greed of gain until it became a habit, binding him in fetters well-nigh impossible to break. While fostering this evil, he would have been filled with horror at the thought of bringing disaster upon Israel; but his perceptions were deadened by the sin, and when temptation came, he fell an easy prey.

"Among church members "in good and regular standing" there are, alas! many Achans. Many a man comes stately to church, and sits at the table of the Lord, while among his

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possessions are hidden unlawful gains, the things that God has cursed. For a goodly Babylonish garment, multitudes sacrifice the approval of conscience and their hope of heaven. Multitudes barter their integrity, and their capabilities for usefulness, for a bag of silver shekels. The cries of the suffering poor are unheeded; the gospel light is hindered in its course; the scorn of worldlings is kindled by practices that give the lie to the Christian profession; and yet the covetous professor continues to heap up treasure. "Will a man rob God? Yet ye have robbed Me" (Malachi 3:8), saith the Lord.

"Achan's sin brought disaster upon the whole nation. For one man's sin the displeasure of God will rest upon His church till the transgression is searched out and put away. The influence most to be feared by the church is not that of open opposers, infidels, and blasphemers, but of inconsistent professors of Christ. These are the ones that keep back the blessing of the God of Israel and bring weakness upon His people.

"When the church is in difficulty, when coldness and spiritual declension exist, giving occasion for the enemies of God to triumph, then, instead of folding their hands and lamenting their unhappy state, let its members inquire if there is not an Achan in the camp. With humiliation and searching of heart, let each seek to discover the hidden sins that shut out God's presence.

"Achan acknowledged his guilt, but when it was too late for the confession to benefit himself. He had seen the armies of Israel return from Ai defeated and disheartened; yet he did not come forward and confess his sin. He had seen Joshua and the elders of Israel bowed to the earth in grief too great for words. Had he then made confession, he would have given some proof of true penitence; but he still kept silence. He had listened to the proclamation that a great crime had been committed, and had even heard its character

definitely stated. But his lips were sealed. Then came the solemn investigation. How his soul thrilled with terror as he saw his tribe pointed out, then his family and his household! But still he uttered no confession, until the finger of God was placed upon him. Then, when his sin could no longer be concealed, he admitted the truth. How often are similar confessions made? There is a vast difference between admitting facts after they have been proved and confessing sins known only to ourselves and to God. Achan would not have confessed had he not hoped doing to avert the by SO consequences of his crime. But his confession only served to show that his punishment was just. There was no genuine repentance for sin, no contrition, no change of purpose, abhorrence of evil.....

"So long as they can conceal their transgressions from their fellow men, many, like Achan, feel secure, and flatter themselves that God will not be strict to mark iniquity. All too late their sins will find them out in that day when they shall not be purged with sacrifice or offering forever. When the records of heaven shall be opened, the Judge will not in words declare to man his guilt, but will cast one penetrating, convicting glance, and every deed, every transaction of life, will be vividly impressed upon the memory of the wrongdoer. The person will not, as in Joshua's day, need to be hunted out from tribe to family, but his own lips will confess his shame. The sins hidden from the knowledge of men will then be proclaimed to the whole world."

Those that become slack in their observance of the little things are in great danger of becoming like Achan and unless they take care of these little things it may be impossible to take care of them when they become big things.

LESSONS FROM ACHAN

So what do we learn from this account of Achan in *Patriarchs and Prophets?* We learn many solemn

truths for the church as well as for the individual Christian. We definitely want to make sure that we are not one of these "Achans."

Achan and the tares in the parable of Jesus (Matthew 13:24-30, 37-43) are very similar. The tares are secret sinners. The rest of the church has no idea that these people are sinners. They look like the rest of the members. They take part in church services, and they look like good Christians, but they have some secret sins they are harboring. In the end they will be found out and dealt with.

In the parable, the enemy planted the tares in the field and likewise, Satan plants tares in the church. They are halfhearted believers from the beginning. Here is where the tares and "Achans" differ. "Achans" have become that way by letting the little things slide. Little by little they have traveled on the wrong pathway. The tares never were converted to begin with but may be church members for awhile – as long as God will tolerate their presence.

And all this is going on in God's church? Can it really be God's church with some of these types of people in it? "The world has no right to doubt the truth of Christianity because there are unworthy members in the church, nor should Christians become disheartened because of these false brethren." Christ's Object Lessons, p. 72,73. The nation of Israel was still God's chosen nation after the experience with Achan, and so likewise God's church today is still God's church with the "Achans" in it. As long as the standard remains the same and the "Achans" are dealt with properly, God's church remains pure.

A common statement we hear from members of fallen church organizations when we point out their false teachings or lack of dealing with open sin is: "But every church has sinners in it. You will not find a perfect church so what makes you different?" These people are unwilling to carry the cross and are looking for a good excuse. Yes, there are sinners even in God's church, BUT God's church will deal with open persistent sin. The standard of the church is what we are to look to and how it is upheld – that makes the difference between the true church and the false churches.

In the tares as well as in Achan's case we do not see true repentance. The tares don't ever become wheat they are bound into bundles and burned. Achan confessed but only when it was too late. "Confessions of sin made at the right time to relieve the people of God will be accepted of Him. But there are those among us who will make confessions, as did Achan, too late to save themselves. God may prove them and give them another trial, for the sake of evidencing to His people that they will not endure one test, one proving of God. They are not in harmony with right. They despise the straight testimony that reaches the heart, and would rejoice to see everyone silenced who gives reproof." Testimonies, Vol. 3, p. 272.

"I was shown that the manner of Achan's confession was similar to the confessions that some among us have made and will make. They hide their wrongs and refuse to make a voluntary confession until God searches them out, and then they acknowledge their sins. A few persons pass on in a course of wrong until they become hardened. They may even know that the church is burdened, as Achan knew that Israel were made weak before their enemies because of his guilt. Yet their consciences do not condemn them. They will not relieve the church by humbling their proud, rebellious hearts before God and putting away their wrongs. God's displeasure is upon His people, and He will not manifest His power in the midst of them while sins exist among them and are fostered by those in responsible positions." Ibid, p. 270. "For all have sinned and come short of the glory of God." Romans 3:23.

So how do we tell an "Achan" from a true follower of Jesus if we have all sinned? It is the spirit of confession. The true followers of Jesus will confess and repent as soon as they recognize their sin. The "Achans" will seek to hide their sins – knowing what they are, hoping that the church won't find out. Only when they are found out will they make confessions – sometimes it is too late.

THE MEDICAL PROFESSION

Recently, at the Youth Conference in Kentucky, this past summer, I had the opportunity to speak with Sister Gretchen Schendel from California. "the medical The topic of profession" came up. Sr. Schendel mentioned the fact that in all of Sister White's testimonies where she speaks of the medical personnel working on Sabbath in hospitals (which is very necessary work), she always spoke in reference to "our institutions" either directly or indirectly, never does she refer to worldly medical institutions. I decided to research this topic when I came home and sure enough she was correct. (See Testimonies, Vol. 7 p. 106 and p. 122, Counsels on Health, p. 236 - there are more but this is just a few). Sister White is clear when she says that we need more medical doctors, nurses, and our own clinics and sanitariums. Jesus said, it is lawful to do well on the Sabbath. Should our medical workers work on the Sabbath? Yes, of course they can't neglect the sick in their own sanitariums and neither would it be right for them to hire non-members to do their work on the Sabbath for them

This leads me to conclude that concessions regarding the Sabbath are to be made in "our institutions" alone. Also, for those who have to work on Sabbath and do receive pay, she writes further that the "fee for such labor should be put into the treasury of the Lord, to be used for the worthy poor who need medical skill but cannot afford to pay for it." *Health, Philantrophic, and Medical Missionary Work, p. 42.* If they do

not follow this counsel they are violating the Sabbath and are perhaps "Achans" in the camp. There is no concession made for worldly medical institutions. In them, you cannot reduce your regular activities by a large degree and do only the essentials (as she counsels that you are supposed to in "our institutions.") You must do as your employer expects. You simply cannot reduce your workload by half and keep the Sabbath in the worldly institutions; therefore the concession appears to be made only in our institutions. Even then she writes about how it is dangerous for a person's faith to work Sabbath after Sabbath. For this reason she stresses the fact that the same people should not work every Sabbath. They are to rotate and take turns. Therefore it is a clear violation of the Sabbath commandment to work in a worldly institution on the Sabbath. There are other doctors and nurses who can fulfill the duties just as well as our church members. In "our institutions" we do not want worldly doctors and nurses coming in to fill the places of those wanting to keep the Sabbath but in a worldly institution it is possible to find others to fill the needed positions.

WHAT TO DO WITH "ACHANS"

What are we to do when an "Achan" is exposed? Some fallen churches ie. SDA have given the excuse (for not dealing with open sin and secret sinners that have been exposed) by saying, we can't disfellowship them or discipline them because we have to have mercy on them – we hope that they change.

Mat. 18:15-17. Gives the right answer as to how to deal with them. Also if you have *Testimonies for the Church*, please read Volume 3, pp. 265 to 269. While following these steps we have to be careful to do all in the spirit of Christ. "It takes much forethought and wisdom from God to labor successfully for the salvation of sinners. If the soul of the laborer is filled with the grace of God, his teaching will not irritate his hearers, but melt its way to their hearts and open them for the reception of the truth." *Testimonies. for the Church, Vol. 4, p. 263.* We can't simply be harsh and just cut them off. Neither can we simply call a church meeting and start deleting names of members we haven't seen for a long time and we know have fallen into sin. No member should be removed unless the steps of Mat. 18 have been followed. They have to be visited and encouraged.

Some weak souls are thankful for the encouragement by their brethren and turn and repent. Others get angry at being exposed and leave. Those that repent never were "Achans". They were simply weak brethren who are grateful for a helping hand. Those that leave in anger were possibly "Achans". Even after they leave, God still loves them and hopes that they will return.

"And when some were disposed to reject their counsel and separate from them, they would say: "Well, if they want to go off, let them go." While such a lack of the compassion, and long-suffering, and tenderness of Jesus was manifested by His professed followers, these poor, erring, inexperienced souls, buffeted by Satan, were certain to make shipwreck of faith. However great may be the wrongs and sins of the erring, our brethren must learn to manifest not only the tenderness of the Great Shepherd, but also His undying care and love for the poor, straying sheep. Our ministers toil and lecture week after week, and rejoice that a few souls embrace the truth; and yet brethren of a prompt, decided turn of mind may, in five minutes, destroy their work by indulging the feelings which prompt words like these: "Well, if they want to leave us, let them go." Ibid, Vol. 2, p. 18,19. If they were not an "Achan" but simply a weak person they may come back some day.

Yes, God is a God of mercy but what does He do in His mercy? Leave a sinner in His sin? No, He exposes them and shows them the plague spots in their character, hoping that the person will decide to change. We have to do the same. We can't leave a person alone who is in sin. They have to be spoken to and counseled and then if they refuse to change, follow the steps of discipline outlined in Mat. 18. If we do nothing we are bringing two curses.

1)A curse to the poor sinner who is allowed to think he is ok, while living in sin. Whether he is working on Sabbath or on a barstool he is out of fellowship with God. He cannot be saved in this condition and we have to let them know. He may claim weakness for his drinking, adultery, or other open sin, but he cannot enjoy the privileges of full fellowship with God's church unless he decides to change his ways. With God all things are possible and he can change if he decides he wants to and comes to the Source of all strength in overcoming sin.

2)A curse is brought upon the church of God. "The church as a whole is in a degree responsible for the wrongs of its individual members because they countenance the evil in not lifting up their voice against it." Ibid, Vol. 4, p. 491. "In His dealings with His people in the past the Lord shows the necessity of purifying the church from wrongs. One sinner may diffuse darkness that will exclude the light of God from the entire congregation." Ibid, Vol. 3, p. 265.

Can we judge who is an "Achan"? No, we can't but we can deal with open sin when we see it. If we don't take care of these possible "Achans" in the camp, the whole church suffers. If an "Achan", after being exposed, but not counseled and disciplined by the church, goes to the barstool – the whole church goes to the barstool – If he/she works on Sabbath, the whole church works on Sabbath.

Only the individual knows whether he is an "Achan" or not. In the days of Sr. White, a man named Elder Canright was quite faithful for many years. After awhile he lost his way and became a bitter enemy of God's church and Sister White. Towards the end of his life he was a miserable wreek. After Sister White died, he cried bitter tears at her gravesite for all he had done against her, acknowledging her as a godly woman. He realized that what he had done was terribly wrong. Someone encouraged him to confess, but he simply said it was too late. How sad for a person to have reached this state.

"The true people of God, who have the spirit of the work of the Lord and the salvation of souls at heart, will ever view sin in its real, sinful character. They will always be on the side of faithful and plain dealing with sins which easily beset the people of God. Especially in the closing work for the church, in the sealing time of the one hundred and forty-four thousand who are to stand without fault before the throne of God, will they feel most deeply the wrongs of God's professed people." Testimonies, Vol. 3, p. 266.

"None are in greater danger than he who feels that his mountain standeth sure. It is then that his feet will begin to slide." Ibid, Vol. 4, p. 560.

We are reaching a stage in this earth's history when the transgression has almost reached its limit. This world is in great confusion. We who know the truth so well, should be earnestly "preparing for what is soon to break upon the world as an overwhelming surprise." Ibid, Vol. 8, p. 28.

"WHY DO WE WORK"?

And whatsoever ye do, do it heartily, as to the Lord, and not unto men; Knowing that of the Lord ye shall receive the reward of the inheritance: for ye serve the Lord Christ. Col.3.23,24

In this article I want to consider a small, but significant, question about work, "why do we work?" I believe that if we clearly understood why we work and knew that we are working for a good reason, in other words considered our work meaningful, there would be a genuine improvement in the quality of our Christian lives. It would also have a positive impact on a world that is perishing in the darkness of dishonesty and selfishness. The way we conduct ourselves as workers has an impact on everything.

For example, consider the role of teachers in our society. The quality of our teachers, whether secular or religious, greatly affects the quality of our children's lives and has a profound effect on the quality of our future. It was the Knights of Labour who first suggested that a day be set aside to honour those in the workforce.

By the turn of the century the holiday had spread far and wide. Today, many countries set aside a day to salute their workers. It also identifies how much we all depend on one another. We all know that the health of our society is determined to a large extent by the state of employment in our nation. The Bible commands us that: "Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for men....." We must put forth every effort to try and improve the way we work, the way we feel about our work, and the effectiveness of the work we do. When we can do this, everyone benefits.

As I think of all this I am reminded of an article some time ago that came out on the front page of the Wall Street Journal about a man named Andrew J. Kreiger, who had his fifteen minutes of fame'. The Journal told how this worker at the age of thirty, succeeded in making \$3 million in one year for himself simply by trading currencies; that was his work, a foreign-currency trader. He made \$300 million for his company, and he walked away with a fair share of that for himself. But Andrew J. Kreiger quit. The Journal later told how Kreiger left his work because he had some deep questions about what he was doing. Apparently, even though he had made a fortune, what he was doing didn't make much sense to him. The Journal quotes him as saying, "There's an absence of people [on Wall Street] who think of why they're doing what they're doing. It disturbs me." Andrew seemed to lose his enthusiasm for trading currencies because he couldn't figure out the reason for his work anymore. He was described as a man who would work practically every waking hour, talking on his car phone to and from work, then at home on his computer, as he shook up the currency markets all around the world. He was a very hard worker indeed, but he quit. Interestingly, it was his son who triggered the chain of events that made him stop and take another look at

himself. One day his six-year-old son asked him what kind of work he did. In response, Kreiger had a hard time explaining to his boy what a foreigncurrency options trader actually does. When he said that he "bought and sold things," his son did not find that answer very satisfactory. So he asked his dad, "Well, when are you going to do something that helps people, like a doctor or a fireman?" Regardless of whether this child's assessment of foreign-currency options trading is accurate, his question prompted Kreiger to develop some serious "why" questions regarding his work and about how much time he was putting in to earn his \$3 million.

Have you ever asked yourself "why do I work"? Maybe you work just to get a pay cheque along with other benefits such as a pension, vacations, and health insurance. Were it not for these benefits, would you walk away from your job tomorrow? The reason we are in so much trouble these days is that most people are working only for money and the "fifteen minutes of fame" that comes with it, nothing They work within these more. confines. Their work is just a job for them. They long for the day when they can escape from the work force. As a result, for example, in some countries, the medical doctors are doing a marginal job. Before they will provide any treatment to a suffering patient, they want proof that the sick can pay the expenses. Some teachers also are

doing a lot of damage to our children by not taking the extra time to help those children who are having difficulties. Some assembly-line workers are turning out products that have to be returned for repairs the day after you purchase them. Even some preachers are dishonoring the name of Christ; they are working only for profit, praise, and promotion. But the Lord has said: "Son of man, prophesy against the shepherds of Israel, prophesy, and say unto them, Thus saith the Lord GOD unto the shepherds; Woe be to the shepherds of Israel that do feed themselves! should not the shepherds feed the flocks? Ye eat the fat, and ye clothe you with the wool, ye kill them that are fed: but ye feed not the flock. The diseased have ye not strengthened, neither have ye healed that which was sick, neither have ye bound up that which was broken, neither have ye brought again that which was driven away, neither have ye sought that which was lost; but with force and with cruelty have ve ruled them. And they were because there is scattered. no shepherd: and they became meat to all the beasts of the field, when they were scattered. My sheep wandered through all the mountains, and upon every high hill: yea, my flock was scattered upon all the face of the earth, and none did search or seek after them." Eze.34:2-6 It is important that ministers, church and everv lay-member leaders seriously evaluate the work he/she is doing, in the fear of God. Let us take a look at our lives and consider our work, and ask ourselves "am I doing any work that I can offer to Jesus; am I spending all my God given time just like Kreiger did?" There is very little time to make wrongs right. Jesus said: "... behold, I come quickly; and my reward is with me, to give every man according as his work shall be. Rev.22.12. We must all ask God for wisdom from above that we may improve the way we work for Him. we must consider Also the effectiveness of the work we do for Him because we know for sure that: "Every man's work shall be made manifest: for the day shall declare it, because it shall be revealed by fire; and the fire shall try every man's work of what sort it is. If any man's work

abide which he hath built thereupon, he shall receive a reward. If any man's work shall be burned, he shall suffer loss: Therefore, my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, forasmuch as ye know that your labour is not in vain in the Lord. For God is not unrighteous to forget your work and labour of love, which ye have showed toward his name, in that ye have ministered to the saints, and do minister".

1 Cor.3:14, 15; 1 Cor.15:58, Heb. 6:10.

However, the problem is not just that some of the results of the work are poor or unacceptable. What's worse and even tragic, is that some people don't know why they are working. Even those who call themselves Christians complain about doing simple church duties. Some times it's hard work just to find church members who are willing and ready to do missionary work for just one hour each month. These people don't realise that they lose one of the major that human beings can joys experience. Doing work that one feels is meaningful and important, is one the greatest sources of satisfaction and feeling of fulfillment a human being can have. Jesus expressed this kind of joy when He said "My meat is to do the will of Him that sent me, and to finish His work... I must work the works of Him that sent me, while it is day: the night cometh, when no man can work." John 4:34, John 9:4. The God who is the center of Christianity is a working God, and ... "His work is perfect" Deut.32:4. In Isaiah 61:1-3 we read about the reasons why Christ worked. "The Spirit of the Lord God is upon me; because the Lord hath anointed me to preach good tidings unto the meek; he hath sent me to bind up the broken-hearted, to proclaim liberty to the captives, and the opening of the prison to them that are bound; To proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord, and the day of vengeance of our God; to comfort all that mourn; To appoint unto them that mourn in Zion, to give unto them beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, the garment of praise for the spirit of heaviness; that they might be called trees of

righteousness, the planting of the Lord, that he might be glorified."

Christ showed how he worked for the Father who sent Him. The joy that he experienced in thesalvation of the sinners was what sustained him in all His sufferings. This should also be our joy, the focus of our labours and our ambitions.

The Bible is filled with working people. One of the most uplifting experiences a Christian can have is to be part of a church whose members (workers) know that their work is important, that it is contributing a great deal to the well-being of others. Such people are proud in doing what they do. Of course, they welcome their wages, but they are not primarily working for wages. They are working because they know that what they are doing is vitally necessary. The inspired pen counsels us to ".. begin to work for those who have not had the light. "All power is given unto Me in heaven and in earth," the Saviour declares, "and, lo, I am with you alway." Matthew 28:18, 20.

What we need is a living faith, faith to proclaim over the rent sepulcher of Joseph that we have a living Saviour, One who will go before us and who will work with us. God will do the work if we will furnish Him the instruments. There needs to be among us a great deal more of prayer and much less of unbelief. We need to lift up the standard higher and still higher before the people. We need to remember that Christ is always at our right hand as we proclaim liberty to the captives and deal the bread of life to hungry souls. When we keep before our minds the urgency and importance of our work, the salvation of God will be revealed in a remarkable manner." "The character 9T p.107. and importance of our work are judged by the efforts made to bring it before the public." HS p.200 "Whatever your duties may be in the various lines of work, always remember that God is the General over us all. You must not withdraw from him to make flesh your arm. We are too much inclined to measure ourselves among ourselves, and compare ourselves one with

another, placing our own estimate upon the importance of our work". SPM p.88.

May the Lord lay our human ambitions in the dust, in order that we may understand and be able to discern whether we are following the unsanctified imaginings of the natural heart or the dictates of the Spirit of God. Self must be abased. God must be obeyed and exalted. Let every soul who fears and loves God, seek for deeper piety. We must have a deeper work of grace, or we shall not be able to endure the test and trial of the conflict coming upon us in these last davs.

Read again the words in Amos 6:1 and Judg. 5:23 "Woe to them that are at ease in Zion, and "Curse ve Meroz. said the angel of the LORD, curse ve bitterly the inhabitants thereof: because they came not to the help of the LORD, to the help of the LORD against the mighty. May God help us that we would not receive the "Curse of Meroz", but instead pray with the ancient prophet Habakkuk "O LORD. revive thy work "and may we add 'in our lives', that when time for us will be no more we will be able to say with Jesus: "I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do. John

17:4. This can only be possible when we clearly understand that the only reason we work, should be to glorify God and to cooperate with Him in the work of seeking and saving the lost. It doesn't matter on our occupation or the skills that we have, whether it is in an office or in a factory, we can glorify God in whatever we do. He has told us that "whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord."

Of course, we know now that Jesus did make the right decision, but how strong was the temptation for Him to just let those who had showed so little appreciation or care for His great sacrifice to perish in their sins.

Jesus is calling for you to come to Him today. Jesus wants you to withdraw your affection from the things in this world and follow Him willingly, lovingly-just like the sacrifice was made which bought you and I back from the power of sin. Here Jesus is tenderly calling thee home just like this song says: "Jesus is tenderly calling thee home-Calling today, calling today; Why from the sunshine of love wilt thou roam Farther and farther away? Calling today, calling today, Jesus is tenderly calling today."

Jesus loves you so much and wants you to be saved so much-what more could He do than He has already done to prove that love for you? Jesus is calling you to come to Him today. Look upon today as the day He is calling you to respond to His love and serve Him. I believe this song will touch your heart, if you will just let Him touch your heart, because tomorrow may be too late.

Also we read Revelation 3:20: "Behold I stand at the door and knock: if any man hear my voice, and open the door, I will come in to him and will sup with him and he with Me." Will we let Him in? "He would not have us stand at this time, amid the perils of the last days, in our own finite strength....It is our privilege to walk in the sunshine of His presence, and to weave into the characters we are forming the golden threads of cheerfulness, gratitude, forbearance, and love. We may thus show the power of divine grace, and reflect light from heaven amid all the frets and irritations that come to us day by day...Then why do we go stumbling along without light?

Every warning, reproof, and entreaty in the Word of God, through His delegated or messengers, is a knock at the door of the heart; it is the voice of Jesus, asking for entrance. With every unheeded. knock vour determination to open becomes weaker and weaker. If the voice of Jesus is not heeded at once, it becomes confused in the mind with a multitude of other voices; the world's care and business engross the attention, and conviction dies away. The heart becomes less impressible, and into perilous lapses а unconsciousness of the shortness of the time, and of the great eternity beyond.

"Many have so much rubbish piled up at the door of the heart that they cannot admit Jesus. Some have difficulties between themselves and their brethren to remove; others have evil tempers, pride, covetousness; with others love of the world bars entrance. All this must be taken away, before they can open the door and welcome the Saviour in.

"How precious is the promise, 'I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with Me.' Oh, the love, the wondrous love of God! After all our lukewarmness and sins He says, Return unto Me, and I will return unto thee, and will heal all thy backslidings.

"Our work is to open the door of the heart and let Jesus come in. He is knocking for entrance....Will you open the door? Jesus is standing at the door of your heart. Let Him in, the heavenly Guest." *Our High Calling*, p. 352 The question is: will we open our heart's door and let Him in?

Here is another song: "Christ is knocking at my sad heart; Shall I let Him in? Patiently pleading with my sad heart; O shall I let Him in? Cold and proud is my heart with sin, Dark and cheerless is all within; Christ is bidding me turn unto Him; O shall I let Him in?"

We read from Our High Calling, p. 18: "We should contemplate the love of Jesus. His mission and His work in reference to us as individuals. We are to say, Jesus so loved me that He gave His own life to save me. The Father loves me for He gave His only begotten Son to save me, that I need not perish, but have everlasting life. It becomes us to ascertain upon what terms Christ promises the gift of eternal life. I answer, It is upon our faith.

"The gift of God's dear Son makes the promises of God ours of a surety.

"How many can say, 'He saves me'? I know that He wants that I should be saved. He looks upon me as of value in His sight, and therefore I know that my thoughts, my words, and my works, all pass in review before Him. Everything that is connected with the purchase of the blood of Christ is of value in the sight of God. By the price paid for our we redemption are under obligation to devote our entire affections to Christ. We are to give God all there is of us; and in giving to God our all, are we to consider that we sustain a great loss?-No, for in giving to Him our talents, we are doubling them. Every gift that He has given to us, when returned to Him receives His blessing, that it may have increased influence in the work of God. Wherever you may be, you are to realize that you belong to Christ.

"The gift of Christ to the world was beyond computation, and no power could compete with God by giving a gift that would bear any comparison to the value of heaven's best treasure. The greatness of this gift was to furnish men with a theme of thanksgiving and praise that would last through eternity. Having given His all in Christ, God lays claim to the heart. mind, soul, and strength of man. Looking upon the treasure which God has provided in the full and complete gift of Christ, we can exclaim: 'Herein is love!'

"Everything is provided for us to be saved, but we have to choose today. We have to make the decision today to get away from the world in our thoughts, because the world hated and killed our Saviour. But we are not of the world John 17:16. Jesus made His decision to save the world and He showed His love for the world in unmistakable terms when He died upon the cross. "As Satan seeks to break down the barriers of the soul, by tempting us to indulge in sin, we must by living faith retain our connection with God, and have confidence in His strength to enable us to overcome every besetment. We are to flee from evil, and seek righteousness, meekness, and holiness.....

"It is time for every one of us to decide whose side we are on. The agencies of Satan will work with every mind that will allow it to be worked by him. But there are also heavenly agencies waiting to communicate the bright rays of the glory of God to all that are willing to receive Him.

"It is ours to choose whether we will be numbered with the servants of Christ or the servants of Satan. Every day we show by our conduct whose service we have chosen....

"Dear young reader, what choice have you made? What is the record of your daily life?" *Our High Calling* p. 15

"For thou art my hope, O Lord God: thou art my trust from my youth.' Psalm 71:5 Jesus calls to every wanderer, 'My son, give me thine heart.' Prov. 23:26....The youth cannot be happy without the love of Jesus. He is waiting with pitving tenderness to hear the confessions of the wayward, and to accept their penitence. "There are temptations on every hand to ensnare the feet of the unwary. Ungodly, corrupt youth exert a strong influence to lead others into forbidden paths. These are among the most successful agents of Satan.....The lovers of the world will often approach under garb а of friendship, and attempt to introduce its and customs practices. Let every true soldier stand ready to resist these allurements....

"Satan attacks us at our weak points; but we need not be overcome. The assault may be severe and protracted, but God has promised help for us, and in His strength we may conquer...The precepts and promises of God's word will arm you with divine power to resist the enemy....Satan will be baffled and defeated when he finds the heart preoccupied with the truth of God. We need also to be often found at the throne of grace. Earnest, persevering prayer, uniting our human weakness to Omnipotence, will give us the victory." Our High Calling, p. 14

Jesus knows that in the world it is very hard to be pure, but He promises to be a Guide to the youth. To retain our connection with God and have confidence in His strength, to enable us to overcome every besetment, we must have a living faith.

Hebrews 11:1

Greetings in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. "He that is Holy, He that is true, the Amen, the Faithful and True Witness." Rev. 3:7, 14. August 7th is a special day for me. On August 7th, 1994, I died and was buried in a watery grave, my sins washed away. I had been attending the Seventh-Day Adventist Church tent meetings held on Grandriver Ave, in the city of Detroit.

After the completing of these meetings, the pastor presented to the church those who had been baptized during the meetings. He requested that the members choose one of these "babes in Christ" to be their spiritual instructor, for "no man can serve God without enlisting against himself the opposition of the hosts of darkness." GC 610. remember returning to my seat alone.

And it came to pass, "there was a man sent from God", who preached, among other things, that the SDA church has blasphemed the Holy Spirit for which there is no forgiveness. He also admonished us to be as the noble Bereans who "received the word with all readiness mind. searched of and the Scriptures" and the Testimonies daily, "whether those things were so." Acts 17:11. The following Sabbath was beautiful, bright and lovely outside. But inside the church, it was cold and gloomy. Most of the members who greeted me with a "Happy Sabbath" didn't appear to be very happy. Even the elders testified of their spiritual condition, "within full of dead men's bones, and of all uncleanness." Matthew 23:27.

Attempts to gain information from them about the Reform Movement were practically ignored. But when I urged a fellow member to ask about the 1888 message, he answered, "O, you mean the curse." A curse?! Then I said, "what need I" any further witness? For I myself "have heard of their own mouth." Luke 22:71. considered that day as my last as a member of the SDA church. Several weeks later, I received a packet containing the Reformation Study Course. And on August 7th, 1994, I all righteousness" and "fulfilled became a member of the family of God, by joining the International Missionary Society, Seventh Day Adventist Reform Movement. "God does not compel any to believe. They can choose to rely upon the evidences He has been pleased to give, or doubt, and cavil, and perish." 1T, 377.

Praise God that the Holy Spirit has touched her heart that she can now discern between those who serve God and those who serve Him not.

Dear Canadian-Caribbean Union Messenger:

Since you are asking for reports and articles I will attempt to write out some thoughts of my recent experience in deciding to join with this movement, as briefly and succinctly as possible. (Hymn: "I'm pressing on the upward way") Perhaps it will rejoice the hearts of the messengers of God who worked hard to convince me that this message of revival and reformation is a reality and needed at this present time.

I must say that these brothers had to wait long as I did not see at once that I must 'come out' of a fallen church myself, as well as attempt to call others out. Although my heart has been deeply pained at the discrepancies I have seen for years in the Seventh-day Adventist church, I still love her and her people; but it seems I must make a move, take a stand. Nothing I have said or done for years has made much impression, it seems. The plot to de-rail her has been too deeply laid.

So now I hope that my decision to leave and join with, I hope, a people who are "few, poor, and a terror to evil-doers" may shake up and wake up some of the dear members I was associated with. I have put my hand to the plow and cannot look back.

Dies Domini: the Pope is ready for a Sunday Law

Quoted from the Pope's encyclical letter, (now posted on the Internet):

1. "The Lord's Day-as Sunday was called from Apostolic times-has alwavs heen accorded special attention in the history of the Church close because of its connection with the very core of the Christian mystery. In fact, in the weekly reckoning of time Sunday recalls the day of Christ's Resurrection. It is Easter which returns week by week, celebrating Christ's victory over sin and death, the fulfillment in him of the first creation and the dawn of "the new creation". It is the day which recalls in grateful adoration the world's first day and looks forward in active hope to 'the last day' when Christ will come in glory and all things will be made new."

(That was section one of a 95 page dissertation that is meant to encourage all Christendom to keep Sunday-the obvious sign of the Roman Catholic Church's power-and claim to unity and primacy in the Christian world. Once the dissertation gets to sections 64 through 67, the letter suddenly refers to the need for government legislation.)

64. "For several centuries, Christians observed Sunday simply as a day of worship, without being able to give it the specific meaning of Sabbath rest. Only in the

fourth century did the civil law of the Roman Empire the weeklv recognize recurrence, determining that on "the day of the sun" the judges, the people of the cities and the various trade corporations would not work. Christians rejoiced to see thus removed the obstacles which until then had sometimes made observance of the Lord's Day heroic. They could now devote themselves to prayer in common without hindrance.

"It would therefore be wrong to see in this legislation of the rhythm of the week a mere historical circumstance with no special significance for the Church and which she could simply set aside. Even after the fall of the Empire. the Councils did not cease to insist upon the arrangements regarding Sunday rest. In countries where Christians are in the minority and where the festive days of the calendar do not coincide with Sunday, it is still Sunday which remains the Lord's Day, the day on which the faithful come together for the Eucharistic assembly. But this involved real sacrifices. For Christians it is not normal that Sunday, the day of joyful celebration, should not also be a day of rest, and it is difficult for them to keep Sunday holy if they do not have enough time.

65. "By contrast, the link between the Lord's Day and the day of rest in civil society has а meaning and importance which go beyond the distinctly Christian point of view. The alternation between work and rest. built

into human nature, is willed by God himself, as appears in the creation story in the Book of Genesis rest something is "sacred" because it is man's way withdrawing from the of sometimes excessively demanding cycle of earthly tasks in order to renew his awareness that everything is the work of God. There is a risk that the prodigious power over creation which God gives to man can lead him to forget that God is the Creator upon whom everything depends. It is all the more urgent to recognize this dependence in our own time, when science and technology have so incredibly increased the power which man exercises through his work

"Finally, it should not be forgotten that even in our own day work is very oppressive for many either because people, of miserable working conditions and long hours-especially in the poorer regions of the world-or because of the persistence in economically more developed societies of too many cases of injustice and exploitation of man When, through the by man. centuries, she has made laws concerning Sunday rest, the Church has had in mind above all the work of servants and workers, certainly not because this work was any less worthy when compared to the spiritual requirements Sunday of observance, but rather because it needed greater regulation to lighten its burden and thus enable everyone to keep the Lord's Day holv. In this matter. mv predecessor Pope Leo XIII in his Encyclical Rerun Novarum spoke

of Sunday rest as a worker's right which the State must guarantee."

We note the reference to every Sunday being Easter, another pagan holiday which the Papal power has "Christianized" from the pagan world. Health Update



Fluoridation in the News

Recent studies have shown that dental fluorosis may be associated with bone changes and low IQ. The finding by Chinese researchers that fluoride intake is associated with low IQ has been confirmed in the United States where animal studies showed neurological damage. Studies show a positive relationship between living in a fluoridated community and Down's Syndrome (Mongolism), cancer (especially a rare bone cancer) and increased fractures of the hip.

There is evidence of decreased birthrates in fluoridated areas. Animal studies prove that fluoride lowers sperm count. These adverse effects are supposed to be avoided by the establishment of tolerable upper intake levels. The FNB/NIH study states these are "set to protect the most sensitive individuals in the healthy general population."

This is nonsense! The upper intake level for infants is almost double the daily amount known to cause skeletal fluorosis. The upper intake levels for ages nine to 70 and over is sufficient to cause crippling skeletal fluorosis in 10 to 20 years!

Fluoridation of 75 per cent of the US population by the year 2000 is American government policy and Canada is traveling the same road. Mandatory fluoridation bills have been passed by a number of states and Canadian provinces.

Most bureaucrats and academics, both in the United States and Canada, have based their careers (and funding) on this thrust to fluoride. The general public, including professionals, have been propagandized for more than 50 years about the benefits and safety of fluoridation and do not have the resources to investigate the claims.

Fluoridation provides a way in which industry, especially phosphate fertilizer manufacturers, can take a waste product (hydrofluosilicic acid) from the smoke stack scrubbers and dump it directly into community reservoirs, thereby circumventing the expensive process of hazardous waste disposal. At the same time, they are turning a profit. By Richard Foulkes, MD

Europe Approves-But Resists

In response to pressure from the US government and multinational companies, the European Commission has approved genetically engineered crops such as transgenic corn and soy from the United States for import into Europe. However, imports to Europe have been effectively on hold because several individual countries, including Luxembourg and Austria, have banned these products.

Since Canada has not segregated its genetically modified canola from unmodified versions, Canadian canola has not been allowed into Europe either. Canadian export of canola to Europe, which was \$180 million in 1996, is nothing for this year.

Bt Toxin kills Beneficial Insects

Researchers at the Swiss federal research station Zuerich-Reckenholz were alarmed to find that Bacillus thuringiensis (Bt) toxin from transgenic plants "jumped over" a food chain to kill useful insects. Transgenic corn containing the Bt toxin gene not only killed European comborers (insect pests), but also killed the larvae of green lacewings, beneficial insects that feed on the comborers.

Another insect pest, the African cottonworm, survived after being fed the Bt corn. However, beneficial green lacewings that fed on the cottonworms died. Bt corn and potatoes, which are already on the market in Canada, are genetically engineered to contain the Bt. Toxin throughout the plant in order to deter insect pests.

Ladybugs Threatened

Recent studies at the Scottish Crop Research Institute (SCRI) found that potatoes genetically modified to deter aphids also damaged beneficial insects. The transgenic potatoes used snowdrop lectin (a plant protein) as the pestresistant gene to suppress the aphids' feeding, growth and reproduction. The aphids that ate the biotech potatoes were then fed to ladybugs, which naturally feed on the aphids. Consequently, the number of fertilized ladybug eggs that failed to hatch was almost three times higher. Female ladybugs that fed on these aphids also only lived half as long as normal.

Misleading Beans

Albert Heijn, the biggest Dutch retail grocery chain, was found guilty of misleading advertising in promoting that biotech soybeans have the same quality as standardized soybeans. Following complaints filed by the Dutch Natural Law Party, the Advertisement Code Commission in the Netherlands decided that Albert Heijn was guilty of false advertising and asked the company to stop making the misleading claims. Albert Heijn is part of the multinational retail chain of Ahold, which subsequently filed an appeal. The Appeal Commission recently came to its decision and again found Albert Heijn guilty of false advertising.

Farmyard Freaks

By manipulating a gene related to muscularity, scientists recently produced a genetically engineered Belgian Blue bull with 20 per cent more beef than normal and weighing three-quarters of a tonne. Such animals engineered for increased muscle/meat content typically do not have the bones to support their own flesh. Hulking Belgian Blues can scarcely walk. Other genetically engineered animals include fast-growing pigs with painful joints because their legs are tiny compared to the rest of the body; fast-growing chickens that suffer from heart disease and whose bones are so feeble they break on contact; and turkeys that are so fleshy that they cannot physically mate, and require artificial insemination.

Biotech Cotton Failure

In Mississippi, farmers could lose millions of dollars due to the failure of biotech herbicide-resistant cotton. Over an area of several thousand hectares, cotton plants have shed their cotton bolls, or produced small malformed bolls. Cotton plants from non-altered varieties were not affected. Legal proceedings by the farmers against the manufacturer are in progress.

Co-Op Begins Biotech Labeling

Shutoken is a large consumer's cooperative union in Japan. It includes 14 co-operatives in the Tokyo area that are now labeling foods as free of genetically engineered ingredients. So far, this system covers 17 major items, including Japanese mainstays like miso, tofu and shoyu. Plans are already under way to greatly expand the number of foods carrying the special biotech label.

Scientists Urge Ban on Biotech Soybeans

In a press release last October, scientists urged world governments to "use whatever methods available" to ban Monsanto's genetically engineered "Roundup Ready" soybeans from their markets.

The plea came from members of the Working Group on Biosafety of the UN-Convention on Biological diversity. The scientists were calling attention to evidence that the herbicide Roundup (glyphosate), when sprayed on legumes such as beans, has been shown to increase the plants' normal levels of estrogenic hormones, posing a potential danger to humans.

"Young children are especially susceptible to elevated levels of estrogens," the scientists warn.

The finding of increased estrogen content in genetically altered soybeans is particularly alarming because elevated estrogen levels in the body have been linked to dysfunction in reproductive, endocrine and developmental processes. For example, exposure of males early in life to estrogens or estrogen-mimicking chemicals (xenoestrogens) may produce stunted sexual development. In both males and females, increased estrogen has been implicated in cancer. Reduced sperm count has also been linked to estrogenic compounds.

"Thou shalt not sow thy field with mingled seed." Leviticus 19:19 Because of man's manipulation what kind of biotech horrors await us? What kind of results will there be long-term from some of these things? No one knows, but from the advance billing-it can't be too good.
